Pre-Game

It was only the 3rd shutout loss of the season. The Firebirds played a high intensity game, but goaltender Pheonix Copley was lights out in the net. A little bit of a change was Nikke Kokko in the net on the first of back-to-back nights. The Reign jumped up to second place in the Pacific with the win. The Firebirds will play two games at home and then go to Texas for two games before the All-Star Break. The combination of Daniel Sprong and Lleyton Roed has paid dividends since Daniel's arrival. Head-to-Head – Both teams have split the first 4 games of the season with the Firebirds winning the last two games. Starting with tonight's game, 3 out of the 4 remaining games will be in Coachella Valley. As with all teams in the tightly packed Pacific Division, tonight's game should an entertaining one.

1st Period

Firebirds outshot and outplayed the Condors, but the Condors got the only goal in the period. A neutral zone turnover resulted in the puck finding its way to Jacob Perreault who made a move around Firebirds defense and walked in to shoot the puck past Stezka.

2nd Period

Firebirds looked to have tied the game, but the puck hit the inside of the post and bounced out. After the Firebirds fumbled the buck, the Condors' Alex Swetlikoff found the back of the net to increase the lead. Just passed the 16-minute mark, Jagger Firkus was able to beet to Condor's to the puck and breakaway to get the first Firebirds goal in several periods. Just when the fans in Acrisure Arena was eye a comeback, 49 seconds later, the Condors' Cam Dineen score the third goal. The Condors are winning the faceoffs and controlling the play.

3rd Period

Condors continued to control the game. The Firebirds got a goal closer when Ryan Winterton picked up the loose change from David Goyette walk-in slap shot from the left circle. Firebirds continued to press, but never able tie the game.



Post-Game

The Condors played a full 60 minutes of hockey. Their forecheck was persistent against a team that played the night before. The won the faceoff battle and made the Firebirds chase the game. The Condors will have a 5-game home stand that spans the All-Star break. The Firebirds will face the hot Abbotsford Canucks who have won 8 straight games.
