Home: CV Firebirds vs. Away: SD Gulls

#### **Pre-Game**

The Gulls are finishing up a 4-game road trip tonight. There have won 4 of a possible 6 points so far. They are last place in the Pacific and near the bottom of AHL. They have a lot of ground to make up with 27 games left to play and 12 points out of a playoff spot. Sasha Pastujov and rookie Sam Colangelo lead the team in scoring. Calle Clang is the number one goalie, but he is not getting much help from his defense. All the defensive players combined for -46 in the +/- category. With the NHL trade deadline coming up, it is anyone's guess to see what the Anaheim Ducks will do at this point. The Gulls might have to focus on player development and be spoilers to the rest of the division.

The Firebirds are coming off a 4-game road trip that straddled the AHL All-Star weekend. Jani Nyman was the Firebirds All-Star representative and got a goal and 2 assists in the 3-on-3 tournament. The Firebirds won two games in Texas and won in overtime against the Gulls last Friday. A loss to the Silver Nights on Wednesday came about on a little bit of bad luck, turn overs in the neutral zone, and poor faceoff results. They are currently 4<sup>th</sup> place in the Pacific. They come home to play a critical 5-game home stand against 5 different Pacific Division opponents. The 4 Nations Tournament is going on in the NHL, and the tournament's timing couldn't be more perfect as the Firebirds are going to have more resources to draw from. Cale Fleury is back from a long stint with the Kraken. Mitchell Stephens was placed on waivers. If no one claims him, he will be coming back to the lineup. Philipp Grubauer has played in goal for two games and has won both games. The Kraken also have some decisions to make before the trade deadline, but the Firebirds are in a good place to get a playoff spot. The younger players have flourished with the all the game time, and the veterans have had time with the Kraken.

Head-to-Head: The Firebirds have won all 4 games against the Gulls this season. All 4 games have been 1 goal wins. The last 3 games have been decided in overtime. Even though the Gulls are stuck in last place, they have given the Firebirds a run for their money. The last game saw the Firebirds give up a two-goal lead, but won the game in overtime on a Daniel Sprong snipe from the slot. The Gulls are playing spoiler so the Firebirds need to play a full 60 and not get caught in a trap game. On a side note, tonight's game will feature the two top goal scoring rookies in the AHL: Gulls' Sam Colangelo and Firebirds' Jani Nyman.

## 1<sup>st</sup> Period

The game started off spirited. Gulls got on the board first with a break down in the defense near the Firebirds goal. Firebirds tied the game on a power play. Ben Meyers slapshot from the point. Both teams exchanged opportunities, but the Gulls got an easy power play goal. 45 seconds later, the Gulls got their third goal on a sloppy play by the Firebirds leaving a backdoor open for a goal. The Firebirds Coach called timeout to deliver a message. Firebirds responded on a power play goal 4 minutes later. Jagger Firkus tip in a shot from Max Lajoie.

## 2<sup>nd</sup> Period

Firebirds cleanup the sloppy play, but the Gulls kept coming. The Gulls had a good portion of the O-zone time, but the Firebirds found a way to tie the game. On a good forecheck, the Firebirds stole the puck on the blue line. Jagger Firkus skated out and made a pass to Tucker Robertson who sized up the shot and put it past the Gulls' Oscar Dansk.

### 3<sup>rd</sup> Period

Within the first 38 seconds, the Gulls scored what would be the winning goal. Another breakdown by the Firebirds defense in front of the net. The Firebirds couldn't get anything going. The Gulls got an empty net goal to seal the game.

### Post-Game

In the pre-game, I mentioned that the Gulls working on being spoilers, and they lived up to it. The Gulls outplayed the Firebirds tonight. The Gulls outskated and won more of the puck battles. From the stats, the Gulls won the faceoff circle in the first period, which set the tone for 3 goals. Although the Firebirds dominated the faceoff circle in the 3<sup>rd</sup> period, they could keep the puck to establish any pressure. The Gulls finally got the first win against the Firebirds this season. The Firebirds didn't match the intensity and played sloppy. The Firebirds only consolation was going 2 for 2 on the power play. The Gulls head home for 2-games started tomorrow against San Jose. The Firebirds will play again tomorrow against the Condors.
