Pre-Game

The defending Calder Cup Champions are not close to the team last year. They have had moments this season, but not many. They are in last place in the Pacific and 10 points out of a playoff spot. The roaster has a combined +/- of -265, and a goal differential of -50. The penalty kill is the worst in the league, and no individual player is standout this season. The power play is the only positive, which is in the top 6 in the AHL. The NHL affiliate Vancouver Canucks are last place in the whole NHL this season. The organization is not doing well.

The Firebirds are on a 4-game winning streak as they appeared to have shaken off the poor play to start the new year. The Firebirds maintain their standing in the Pacific division. They beat the Gulls last night 4-0, which is the second shutout of Gulls in San Diego this year. A little pay pack from the opening night loss. The challenge will be winning a 2nd game on back-to-back nights. Jani Nyman has been a factor with 7 goals in 8 games since his return, but most important, offensive contributions are coming from everyone on the team. The biggest issue this season has been the defense and puck handling in the defensive zone.

The Kraken have found their stride again as well, and they are back in the hunt for the top spot in the NHL Pacific. The Kansas City Mavericks are on an 11-0-0-0 streak and the have taken control of first place in the Mountain division. They are 6 points ahead of the 2nd place team with games in hand.

One final note: Jagger Firkus and Tyson Jugnauth were named to the 2026 AHL All Start game.

Head-to-Head

The Firebirds have won all 4 games against the Canucks this season. The Firebirds played last night, and they are 3-6-1-0 in the second game on back-to-back nights. The game was physical so we will see how that effects tonight's game. A Firebirds win will let them leap frog over the idle Barracuda into 4th place. For the Canucks, this is the final game of the 3-game road trip in which they will want to finish strong. They split 2 games with the Gulls this week. A team looking for points and a day of rest will be a good test for the Firebirds. This will be the last time the teams will face each other until April.

1st Period

The Canucks took earlier control of the play, but the Firebirds got some push back and the only goals in the period. A Canucks high sticking penalty resulted in the first goal. Ty Nelson passed the puck down to the goal line where Mitchell Stephens was setup. Mitchell waited as John Hadn got open in the paint and made a pass that John was able to put home. Firebirds killed off a penalty over their own in the middle of the period. At 18:00, the Canucks were called for their second penalty, and the Firebirds scored within 4 seconds Logan Morrison score from with the faceoff circle.

2nd Period

No scoring in the period. The Canucks had most of the O-zone time. They were able to recover pucks and keep it in the zone. The Canucks had the Firebirds trapped on the ice on the first power play, but could score. The rest of the way, the refs let some penalties go, until the end of the period. Canucks will be on the power play to start the period.

3rd Period

The Canucks started controlling the period, but once the Firebirds got the puck, they scored the 3rd goal. A defensive breakdown Jani Nyman was able to find Logan Morrison in the slot. Logan was able to bury the puck. The Canucks never really generated much chances the rest of the way. They had shots, but nothing grade A. Jack LaFontaine stood tall in net. The Firebirds clamped down in net and played a strong defensive game.

Post-Game

The Firebirds win another shutout, and this time it was on back-to-back nights, which is a first in Firebirds history. 128 minutes without letting the other team score a goal. The win moves them to 4th place in the Pacific. They are now 4-6-1-0 on the 2nd game of back-to-backs. Logan Morrison has now scored 20 goals this season, which is a first in his career. He and Jagger Firkus are in the AHL top 15 points leaders. Most important; multiple players got on the score sheet. The Firebirds continue the home stand and play against the Barracuda on Wednesday.

Although they had the most O-zone time and 3 power plays, the Canucks couldn't generate any scoring. They played competitively, but the penalty kill let them down. They head home for 4 games. Two against Laval Rocket and 2 against the Gulls.

Interesting Firebirds stats so far:

- 4 games in row (12 periods) that the team never trailed in regulation.
- 2 different Firebirds got a hat-trick on back-to-back nights: Jagger Firkus (vs. BAK 11/15/25) and Jacob Melanson (vs ABB 11/16/25)
- Two goalies have an assist in the season – first time since inaugural season. Kokko has 2 assists.
- The line of J.R., Avon, Logan Morrison, and Jagger Firkus scored at least one goal 9 games in a row (11/7/25-11/28/25).
- Goalie shutouts:
 - Nikke Kokko got his first regular season shutout. (vs. Gulls 5–0 11/28/2025).

- Victor Östman got his second regular season shutout (vs. Gulls 4-0 1/17/2026)
- 12 games streak where the Firebirds have scored 3 goals in a game (Started vs Col 11/5/25 – 12/6/25).
- 4-6-1-0 in the 2nd game on back-to-back nights.
- 5-5-0-0 when playing a team back-to-back with day(s) off in-between.
- 128 minutes in a row without letting the other team score a goal. (Tex 2/14/26, SD 1/17/26, ABB 1/18/26)
