Pre-Game

The Condors are coming off 2 wins against the Silver Knights this past weekend, which snapped a 4-game losing streak. Both wins have propelled them up the Pacific standings. The Condors are mostly in the middle of the AHL on many stats. Rem Pitlick is in the top 20 in points. Seth Griffith, Viljami Marjala, and Roby Järventie have also provided the main offensive punch. Rookies Quinn Hutson and Rhett Pitlick have 4 goals each. The Parent club, Oilers, are coming their straight second Stanley Cup final defeat. The Oilers are struggling in the early part of the NHL season, but they have not recalled anyone from the Condors.

The Firebirds come home from a two-game road trip against the road runners. The Firebirds won the first game, but lost the second game in over time. Until the overtime loss, the Firebirds went 9 straight periods without trailing in a game. The fast starts in each game have forced opponents to play catch up. The OT loss to the Roadrunners on Saturday was tough one to take. Östman had a defensive player pushed into him, and Ryan McGregor was able to score into an open net. This is the second time this season where Östman was hit by a defensive player that led to a goal. Before then the Roadrunners had a majority of the play in the second half of the game and limited the Firebirds to 7 shots in the 3rd period. Logan Morrison has bubbled to the top of the team offensive leader board. Lleyton Roed has average a point per game since coming back from injury.

Head-to-Head

The Condors won the first game this season in overtime. Another game where the Firebirds never trailed until the end. Also, a game marred by Victor Ostman being interfered with that allowed the game winning goal to be scored. Both teams are tied in points in the Pacific. On paper, both teams are very even in the stat sheet. Expect tonight's game to be evenly matched.

Today is Veterans Day honoring all those who have served and currently serving. The Firebirds are hosting a pre-game ceremony with the youngest and oldest, Marines in attendance: Staff Sergeant Dallas Kvach and Msgr Jerry McCleary.

1st Period

As expected the teams played an even period with both teams getting chances. After 10 minutes of back and forth, the Firebirds were on the second power play. Nice puck movement at the top of the zone led to beautiful down low pass to Logan Morrison next to the net. Logan tapped the puck in for goal number one. Condors got some grade A shots as forwards parked unchecked, but Kokko stood tall in the net. At the 17-minute mark, the Firebirds broke into the attacking zone, J.R. Avon made a little pass to Jagger Firkus who left the puck for a charging Ty Nelson. Ty had a clear shot at the net as a Condor went down in the zone, and Ty didn't miss the snipe past Tomkins for his first goal of the season.

2nd Period

Well so much for even match. The Firebirds came out swinging with the 4 goals scored in the period and a mess of penalties. The Firebirds started the period on a penalty kill. As the penalty time went done, JR Avon got a breakaway to get the 3rd goal. Ty Nelson got his second goal on a deflection off his leg. After review, the goal was good. 30 seconds later Mitchel Stephens found the back of the net, and the fisticuffs started going. 7-minutes later JR Avon jumped on the ice when another Firebird had to go off when his helmet came off and was in the right place in the slot to score the 6th goal of the game. The Condors did have chances, but the Firebirds were spot on defense. When there were breakdowns Kokko stood tall to keep the Condors off the scoreboard.

3rd Period

The Condors made their push to get back into the game, and the Firebirds took a step back. The Condors got goals from their top three players: Rem Pitlick, Seth Griffith, and Viljami Marjala. Tempers flared in the period and several penalties were called. 3 players got game misconducts. The Firebird penalties lead to 2 of the 3 Condor goals. The game wasn't close.

Post-Game

The Firebirds made up for the loss in Bakersfield several weeks ago with a solid team win. 8 players were on the score sheet. With another fast start, the Firebirds have not trailed in the last 12 periods in regulation. The Condors are off to play San Diego on Friday, before returning home to face the Firebirds again. The Firebirds next game is against the Condors so expect the Condors to be ready for the game 3 of their 8 game season series.
